#### **EUROCLIO COORDINATORS**



**Aysel GOJAYEVA** is a post-graduate student from Leiden University in the Netherlands in MA European Union Studies. She wrote her MA thesis in the topic: European Neighbourhood Policy and Conflict Resolution in the South Caucasus. Her BA degree was in the field of Methodology of Teaching Foreign Languages: English. Before her studies in the Netherlands, she was actively involved into the youth work as the elected board member of Euro-

pean Students' Association Baku Public Union (AEGEE-Baki) in her home country Azerbaijan. Aysel was later elected a multiplier of the Youth In Action Programme (YIA) within SALTO Eastern Europe and Caucasus Resource Centre supported by the European Commission and held this position from March 2009 till September 2010. This position gave her an opportunity to enrich her understanding and experience in European youth work and share her experience with local NGO representatives in Azerbaijan mainly in the field of project acquisition within YIA programme. He is also one of the authors of recent history project in Macedonia "Retelling History"(2007).
