On 31st May, the Copenhagen Post and Tele Museum will host the second MeLa Research Meeting promoted within the Research Field 06. The meeting will be concluded by the second MeLa public Seminar.

These events are aimed at presenting the Project, reporting about preliminary research findings, enhancing dialogue amongst MeLa researchers, external scholars and practitioners, and providing further stimuli for the subsequent phases of the research.
